

Dashboard overview


The **dashboard overview** is where you can review New European Bauhaus projects and community.

Your first step is to choose a 'Country', 'City/Municipality', or 'Community'.

Once you have made and confirmed your selection, the dashboard will instantly produce the data results.

There are 3 interrelated sets of data on the dashboard overview:

- 1. The **map** provides an international geographical coverage of New European Bauhaus activities;
- 2. The **bar chart** compares national New European Bauhaus development, as well as, categorical developments (e.g. different types of dedicated calls) within the country;
- 3. The **table** shows descriptive information of New European Bauhaus community and links directly to the websites of the local and regional community.



In the following page, we illustrate the dashboard overview with an example. Follow the 4-step guide with the illustrated example.

Dashboard overview - example

1. Choose by 'Country'

Select the country 'Austria' and 'Belgium' by typing them in the search box or using the scroll bar to find them.

To **confirm** your selection, you must press the check function. Without clicking the check function, your selection will not be executed.

Before you make another selection,, delete your selections by clicking on the 'Clear Selection' function.

2. Customise the map region

You set the map frame to your desired scope by using the navigation system on the map's upper-right corner.

To zoom in or out of the map, you press on the zoom-in or zoom-out function to set a scope for the map.









3. Compare the bar chart

You compare the New European Bauhaus developments in Austria and Belgium using the bar chart.

You can further explore the different New European Bauhaus activities in Austria by clicking on its country bar.


You press the check box, again, to confirm your country selection, and will see the Bauhaus activities in Austria in the legend.

4. Track & download

You review the descriptive information on Bauhaus activities in Austria in the table.

You can use the scroll bar to see the full list of activities or to enlarge the table with the enlarge function.

You download the data on Austria from the table by clicking on the more (...) function, which will display the download button as one of the functions.

Country fiche


The **country fiche** is where you can review national New European Bauhaus projects and community.

Your first step in using the dashboard overview is to choose a 'City/Municipality'.

Once you have made and confirmed your selection, the dashboard will automatically produce the data results.

There are three interrelated sets of data on the country fiche:

- 1. The **map** provides a national geographical coverage of New European Bauhaus activities;
- 2. The **tree map** compares categorical New European Bauahaus developments such as number of community members, ; and
- 3. The **table** shows descriptive information of national New European Bauhaus community members and links directly to their websites.


Country fiche - example

1. Choose by 'City/Municiaplity'

Taking Austria as an example, you select 'Dornbirn', 'Engerwitzdorf', and 'Vienna' by typing them in the search box or using the scroll bar to find them.

To confirm your selection, you must click on the check function. Without clicking the check function, your selection will not be executated.

Before you make another selection, delete your selections by clicking on the 'Clear Selection' function.



2. Customise the map region

You set the map frame to your desired scope by using the navigation system on the map's upper-right corner.

To zoom in or out of the map, you press on the zoom-in or zoom-out function to set a scope for the map.



3. Distinguish the various Bauhaus activities in Austria


The tree map shows you the priority of different Bauhaus initiatives in Austria.

You can further filter the tree map by choosing to look at 'Partners' and NEB Prizes - NEB Awards winners.

You confirm your selection by clicking on the check function.

Once your action is executed, the map and the table will only show partners and NEB Prizes winners to be in Vienna and Dornbirn.

4. Track & download


You review the descriptive information on partners and NEB Prizes winners in Dornbirn and Vienna in the table.
